I have entered the url "http://helloworld.com" in my browser URL bar

## When

I hit the enter / return key

## Or

I click on the "Go" button of my browser

## Then

I should see a web page displaying the phrase "Hello world"

# Acceptance criteria (for Platform Engineer)

## ✓ Scenario 2: Fast page load

---

### Given

I have entered the url "http://helloworld.com" in my browser URL bar

### When

I hit the enter / return key

### Or

I click on the "Go" button of my browser

**Then**

**a web page is loaded under 1 second**

**And I should see the phrase "Hello world"**
